

CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Arlington residents and business owners, due to the time of the year, garbage companies have been notified to not use gravel alleyways until further notice. The gravel alleys are

getting soft and cannot handle the large garbage trucks driving on them. Due to this condition, the City is asking all residents and affected businesses to place their garbage cans and recycling containers curbside.

SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK

Severe Weather Awareness Week in Minnesota is April 21st-April 25th. Severe Weather Awareness Week is a good opportunity for residents of Arlington to make sure they are prepared for severe weather when it strikes. Using the Department of Public Safety website (www.severeweather.state.mn.us) as a guide, you can build a family plan, build an emergency kit, and practice proper procedures. Having the right information can be a lifesaver. Severe Weather Awareness Week is a good time to learn what you should do in a lightning storm, heat wave, tornado, or flash floods. In conjunction with Severe Weather Awareness Week, Thursday, April 24th is Tornado Drill Day. The first statewide drill is at 1:45pm, while the second statewide drill is at 6:55pm. All communities will activate their warning systems and emergency sirens will sound. For more information on severe weather, be sure to visit the Minnesota Department of Public Safety website.

HYDRANT FLUSHING TO TAKE PLACE

Residents of Arlington should be aware that People Service staff plan to flush hydrants the weeks of April 14 through May 2. During this time, water pressure may fluctuate and residents may notice some discoloration and cloudiness in the water. The water is safe to drink and should clear up in a few days. Running tap water for a short time should alleviate these problems.

REDUCE THE RISK OF FROZEN PIPES

In early March, some residents started to experience frozen water pipes to their homes. The City staff, along with People Service, started to get the word out to residents and businesses for all to begin checking the temperature of their water. If the temperature was below 40 degrees, from the first available faucet, they were encouraged to leave a steady stream of water running from that faucet to prevent the water pipes from freezing. To aide those users that are recording below normal water temperatures and letting a steady stream of water run, the City Council has granted a credit on the water/sewer charges they are incurring due to the larger amount of water being used. Despite the more Spring-like weather, the risk of frozen pipes still remains. Residents are encouraged to continue testing their water temperature. If

your water temperature drops below 40 degrees, notify the City Office immediately and "Let it Run". If you have questions on the "Let it Run" program, call the City Office at 507-964-2378.



ARLINGTON NAMED "TREE CITY USA" FOR THE SIXTH STRAIGHT YEAR

For the sixth straight year, Arlington has been named a Tree City USA community by the Arbor Day Foundation. The Tree City USA program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in cooperation with the National Association of State Foresters and the USDA Forest Service. Arlington has met the four standards to become a Tree City USA community: having a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, a comprehensive community forestry program, and an Arbor

Day observance and proclamation. Communities that receive a Tree City USA recognition not only have taken the time to meet these four standards, they also recognize that:

1) Trees promote healthier communities by filtering the air we breathe by removing dust and other particles. 2) Trees moderate climate, conserve water and provide habitat for wildlife. 3) Trees reduce the "heat island effect" in urban areas caused by pavement and buildings. 4) Trees can increase property values and reduce energy use and add beauty to our homes and neighborhoods. 






NOTICE OF SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING OPEN HOUSE ELECTRICAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT
